

Ginko Wrap Bracelet

Try using the new Matubo Ginko beads in this beginner-friendly project



Material (for one bracelet)

Matubo Ginko (approx. 12 pcs) Matubo Rulla (approx. 7 pcs) Pinch beads (approx. 12 pcs) Matubo 11/0 (or 11/0 Japanese seed beads) (approx. 30 pcs) 15/0 Japanese seed beads (approx. 60 pcs)

Beading wire, crimp beads (2pcs), bead tips (2pcs), jump rings (3pcs), a clasp (1pc).

(This amount of material will give you a bracelet that is approximately 19cm/7.4in long – including the clasp.)

You can also use double or triple that length and create

a wrap-style bracelet, that is - as the name suggests -

worn wrapped multiple times around your wrist (like the

turquoise-brown bracelet on the front page).

1) Cut two pieces of beading wire (I usually use 0,015-inch diameter for this kind of bracelets).

Both pieces should be a little longer than the desired length of the bracelet.



5) Then use the flat-nose pliers to close the bead tip.




6) Start stringing beads on the opposite end of the wire.

First, string three 15/0s and one 11/0 on each end.



2) On both pieces of wire string a bead tip (closed side first) and then one crimp bead.



7) Then add one Rulla (one end of the wire through each hole).

8) Then one 11/0 and one

15/0 on each end.



3) Move the crimp bead to the end of both wires and then squeeze it with flatnose pliers, so it becomes flat.






9) Then one Ginko (one end of the wire through each hole, from the "outside").



4) Then pull the bead tip over the crimp bead (the bead goes inside the bead tip).






10) Then one 15/0, one pinch bead and one 15/0 on each end.



15) Take another bead tip and string it on both ends of the wire (closed side first), then string a crimp bead.



 Then one Ginko (one end of the wire through each hole, from the "inside").



16) Move both components as close to the beads as possible and then squeeze the crimp bead with flatnose pliers. Then cut the excess of the beading wire and then close the bead tip with the crimp bead inside.

17) This is what you should

get.



12) Then one 15/0 and one 11/0 on each end.






18) Use jump rings to attach

a clasp of your choice.



13) This is what you should get. Repeat steps 7–12, until you reach the desired length.



14) You should finish the bracelet with a Rulla bead and then one 11/0 and three 15/0s on each end.



19) The bracelet is finished.
