Elements Necklace and Bracelet on Chain

Materials for necklace:

- 75 grams Elements (BPE2)
- 1 metre silver plated chain (C7)
- 19 silver plated 50 mm eye pins (JF80)

Materials for bracelet:

- 25 grams Elements (BPE2)
- 1 lobster clasp (JF84B)
- 1 jump ring (JF105)
- 9 silver plated 50 mm eye pins (JF80)

Tools:

- Round nose pliers (S115)
- Combination pliers (S19)

Necklace

Thread beads onto the eyepins. Use either just one of the larger beads on an eyepin or a medium bead between two smaller beads or three small matching beads. This gives an interesting irregular effect. Use about 19 eyepins.

Make a loop in the top of each eyepin (see guide). Connect each beaded eyepin together combining them randomly to give a varied effect.

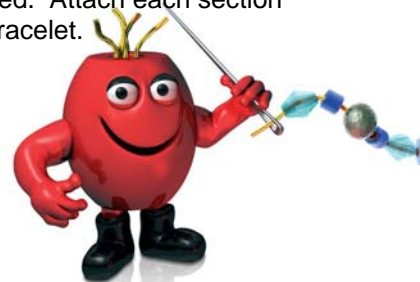
Cut the chain to the desired length. Attach each end of the chain to the loop on the eyepins at the each end of the beaded section.

Bracelet

Start in the same way as the necklace. Use about 9 eyepins and vary the length as required. Attach each section together. Fasten the lobster clasp to one end and the jump ring to the other to finish the bracelet.

Tip

The length of the beaded section of the necklace and the bracelet can be varied as required. Group your beads together and lay out your design before commencing - a beadboard is useful for this (S129).
