## HONEYCOMB WRAP BRACELET

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This fabulous stash busting bracelet wraps your wrist in your favorite leftover Honeycomb beads.

Skill level: Confident beginner and up
Techniques: Herringbone, ladder stitch, ending/adding thread, using pliers
Finished size: $151 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$

## MATERIALS

3.5 g size 11 seed beads (color A )
0.5 g size 11 seed beads (color B)

25 or more Honeycombs/Honeycomb Jewels in assorted colors
2 KALIVIA Cymbal ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ bead endings
2 size 5 mm jump rings
Clasp of choice
6 lb Fireline ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ or D weight beading thread
Size 11 beading needle
Scissors/Thread zapper
Pliers to work jump rings


## TIPS:

- Check that all holes of two-hole beads are clear before stitching.
- This project uses a lot of thread. End and add thread with the technique you are comfortable with.

## LADDER STITCH - Rows 1 and 2

Step 1. String a needle on two yards of Fireline and attach a stop bead leaving a four-inch tail to weave in and secure at your earliest convenience.

Step 2. String two $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$, one KALIVIA ending and two $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$. Sew through all the beads again to form two columns of beads and exit one column of $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$.

NOTE: Herringbone stitch will be used in the following steps. Each row is stitched by sewing down through one bead and sewing up through two beads to attach each new column.

## FIGURE 2 - Herringbone with $11^{\circ}$ s

Step 3. String two $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$, sew through one $11^{\circ}$ in the first column and back through two $11^{\circ}$ s of the second column. Repeat three more times. NOTE: The beadwork should have five rows of two columns of $11^{\circ}$ s.

## FIGURE 3 - Herringbone with a Honeycomb

Step 4 (black thread). String one Honeycomb, two $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$ and sew through the second hole of the Honeycomb and the $11^{\circ}$ below it. Sew up through the second column $11^{\circ}$, Honeycomb and $11^{\circ}$ added in this step.

Step 5 (red thread). Stitch four rows with size $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$. Each beaded section will have five rows.
Step 6. Repeat Steps 4 and 5 alternating the color of the Honeycombs until the desired length, ending with four rows of size $11^{\circ}$ s. NOTE: My bracelet contains 24 Honeycombs and measures approximately $14^{\prime \prime}$ excluding the clasp. Each herringbone and Honeycomb section measures approximately $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## FIGURE 4 - Attach second ending

Step 7. String one $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$, a KALIVIA, one $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$ and sew down through two $11^{\circ}$ s of one column. Sew up through two $11^{\circ}$ s of the second column. Continue through the $11^{\circ} /$ KALIVIA $/ 11^{\circ}$ just added. Repeat the thread path once to reinforce (not illustrated).

NOTE: If you have enough thread to add the side embellishment, sew through one column of the $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$ to correctly position the thread for the next. If you do not have enough thread, secure the working thread in the beadwork and trim excess. Secure a new 1.5 yards length of Fireline within the beadwork and exit a column of $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$.

## FIGURE 5 - Embellishment

Step 8. String two $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$, one $11^{\circ} \mathrm{B}$, and two $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$. Sew through the Honeycomb from bottom up and back through the five $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$ added. Continue through the next column of $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$. Pull thread snug so that the $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$ fit around the outside of the Honeycomb. Repeat this step for the length of the bracelet.

NOTE: Different finishes of size $11^{\circ}$ s vary slightly in size. If you feel too much thread is showing with two $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$ in this step, string three $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$, one $11^{\circ} \mathrm{B}$, and three $11^{\circ} \mathrm{A}$ as the embellishment edge.

Step 9. Continue through the KALIVIA and the column on the other side of the bracelet.
Step 10. Repeat Step 8 for the length of the other side of the bracelet. Secure the working thread within the beadwork and trim the excess.

Step 11. Use pliers to open a jump ring, insert into one KALIVIA loop and half of the clasp. Close the jump ring. Repeat to attach the other half of the clasp.
