



Groom Lake Pendant

Make this "technical", donut-shaped pendant with Matubo NIB-BIT beads



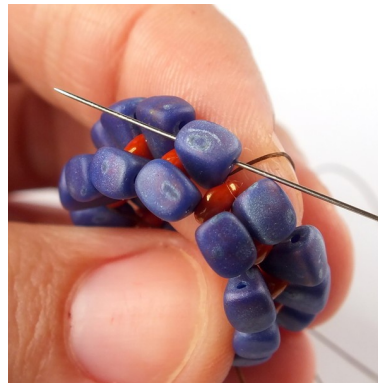
Material (for one pendant):

- Matubo NIB-BIT (36 pcs)
- Matubo 8/0 (approx. 3 grams)
- Matubo 6/0 (12 pcs)
- Matubo Miniduo (12 pcs)
- 11/0 Miyuki seed beads (approx. 1 gram)
- 15/0 Miyuki seed beads (approx. 2,5 gram)
- Bail or a large jump ring
- Beading needle and thread (Nymo, Fireline)

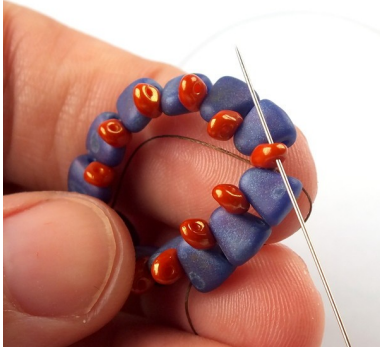
Difficulty: Intermediate



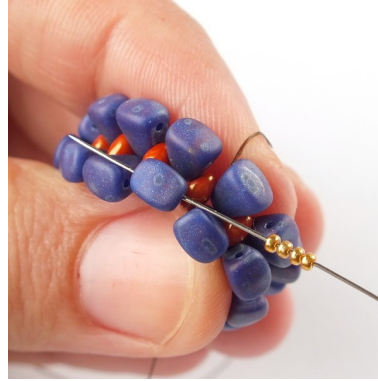
1) String one Miniduo, one NB (narrow end), one Miniduo, one NB (narrow end) ... total 12 of each.



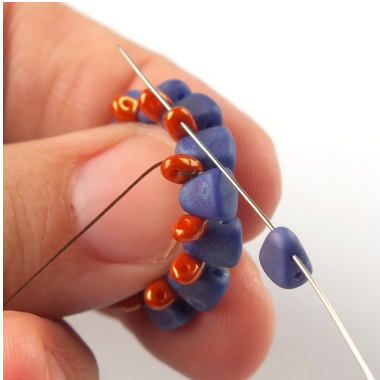
6) And then finish the step-up by passing back through the upper hole of the same NB bead.



2) Slide all the beads to the end of the thread. Tie a square knot to form a circle, then pass through the upper hole of the nearest Miniduo.



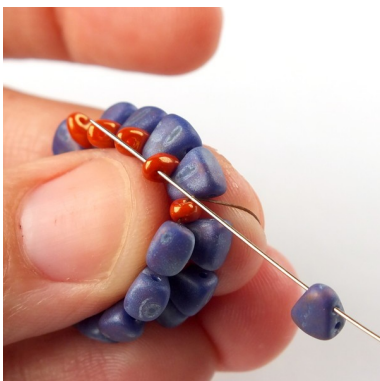
7) Add four 15/0s and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead on the opposite side of the ring.



3) Add one NB (narrow end) and pass through the upper hole of the next Miniduo.



8) Add four 15/0s and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead on the opposite side of the ring.



4) Repeat step 3 ...



9) Repeat steps 7 and 8 ...



5) ... until you reach the end of the row. At the end of the row add one last NB, pass through the upper hole of the next Miniduo and through the lower hole of the next NB bead.



10) ... until you reach the end of the row.



11) Pass through the nearest group of four 15/0s ...



12) ... and then pass through the upper hole of the next "unused" NB bead ...



13) and then pass through the next four 15/0s...



14) ... and then again through the upper hole of the next "unused" NB bead.

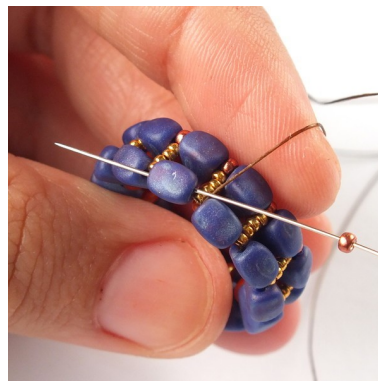
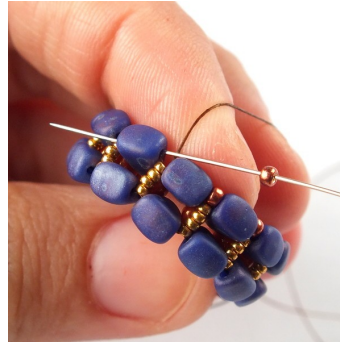


15) Repeat steps 11 - 14, until you reach the end of the row.



16) The thread exits from one of the NB beads. Add one 11/0 and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead on the same side of the ring.

17) Repeat step 16, until you reach the end of the row.



18) Weave through beads to get to the other side of the ring and here also add 11/0s between NB beads, like in steps 16 and 17.



19) This is what you should get.



20) Pass through the first 11/0 you added in this row.



21) Add two 15/0s, one 11/0, one 8/0, one 11/0 and two 15/0s and pass through the next 11/0 on the opposite side of the ring.



26) Add two 15/0s and pass through the nearest (11/0, 8/0, 11/0) in the row.



22) And again ... add two 15/0s, one 11/0, one 8/0, one 11/0 and two 15/0s and pass through the next 11/0 on the opposite side of the ring.



27) Repeat steps 25 and 26 ...

23) Repeat steps 21 and 22, until you reach the end of the row.



28) Until you reach the end of the row.



The thread should exit from one of the (11/0, 8/0, 11/0) groups.



29) Add one 6/0 and pass through the next (11/0, 8/0, 11/0) group



24) Pass through the first two 15/0s, 11/0, 8/0 and 11/0 you added in this row.

30) Repeat step 29, until you reach the end of the row. At the end of the row make the step-up by passing through the last (11/0, 8/0, 11/0) group and through the first 6/0 in the row.



25) Add two 15/0s and pass through the nearest "unused" 11/0.





31) Add one 8/0, one NB (narrow end) and one 8/0 and pass through the next 6/0.



36) ... until you reach the end of the row.



32) Repeat step 31, until you reach the end of the row.



37) Make the step-up by passing through the first 8/0 in this row.



33) At the end of the row pass through the first (8/0, NB, 8/0) you added in this row.



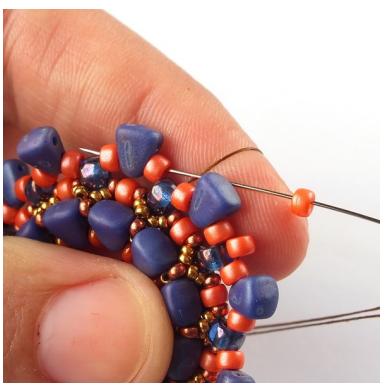
38) Add two 15/0s and pass through the upper hole of the next NB in the row.



34) Add one 8/0 and pass through the next (8/0, NB, 8/0) group in the row.



39) Add two 15/0s and pass through the next 8/0 in the row.



35) Repeat step 34 ...



40) Repeat steps 38 and 39, until you reach the end of the row.



41) Pass through the next two 15/0s and through the upper hole of the next NB bead



42) Add two 15/0s, one 8/0 and two 15/0s and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead.



43) Repeat step 42, until you reach the end of the row.



44) The thread exits from the NB bead. Add two 15/0s and pass through the next "new" 8/0.



45) Add two 15/0s and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead.



46) Repeat steps 44 and 45, until you reach the end of the row.

47) The thread exits from one of the NB beads. Add four 15/0s and one 11/0 and pass through the nearest 6/0. Pull snug.



48) Add one 11/0 and four 15/0s and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead.



49) Repeat steps 47 and 48, until you reach the end of the row.

50) The pendant is finished. Tie a few half-hitch knots and cut off all the remaining thread.

51) Attach a bail under one of the NB beads in the last row (like shown in the photo) or pass a jump ring through one of the 8/0s in the last row.
