



## "Lily" beaded bead

Small beaded rondelle with pinch beads and Superduos



Material (for one bead):

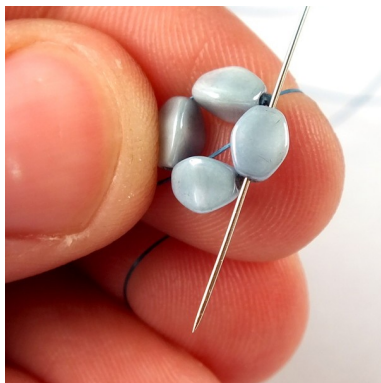
- Matubo Superduo (10 pcs)
- Pinch beads (15 pcs)
- Matubo 8/0s (10 pcs)
- 15/0 Japanese seed beads (approx. 0,5 gram)
- 11/0 Japanese seed beads (approx. 0,5 gram)
- 8mm round acrylic or wooden bead
- Beading needle and thread (Nymo, Fireline)

Difficulty: Beginner/Intermediate

TIP: Right angle weave can be a bit tricky when it comes to keeping the right tension. If you have trouble keeping your tension tight, you can weave through each unit one more time before moving on to another one.

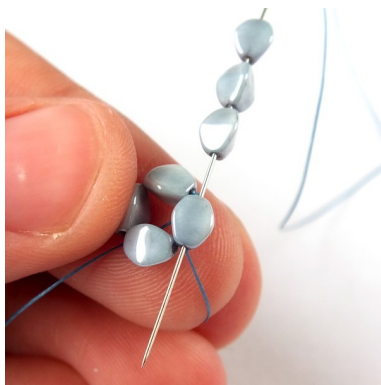


1) String four pinch beads and slide them to the end of the thread.

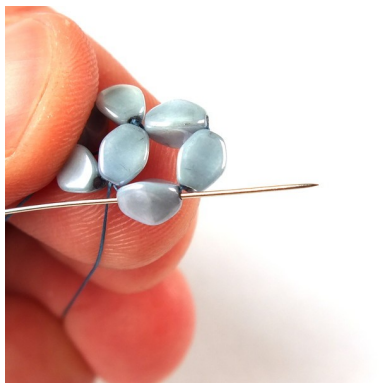


2) Tie a square knot. The beads should form a little square.

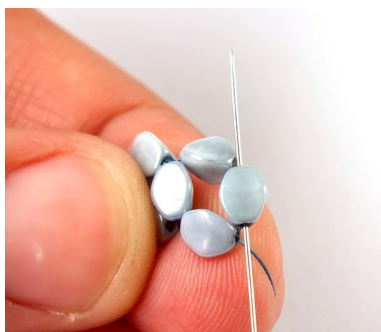
Pass through the nearest pinch bead.



3) Add three more pinch beads and pass through the pinch bead from the previous step again.

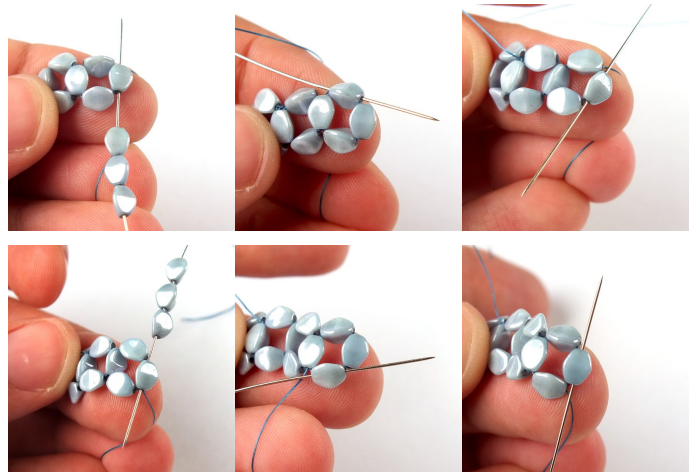


4) Pull snug. Then pass through the nearest new pinch bead ...



5) ... and then through the next one.

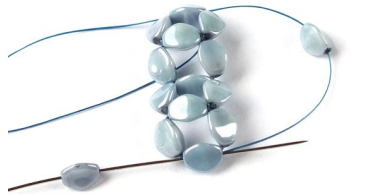
6) Repeat steps 3 - 5 two more times. You should have a strip that is 4 "units" long.



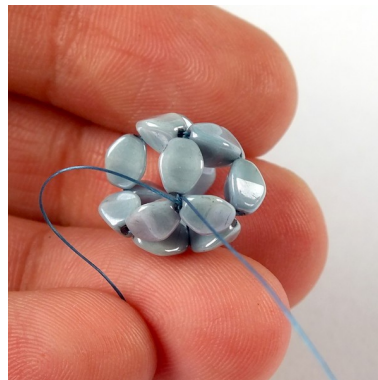
7) Add one pinch bead and pass through the pinch bead on the opposite side of the strip.

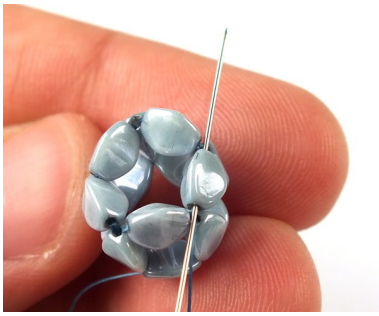


8) Add one more pinch bead and pass through the "first" pinch bead again.

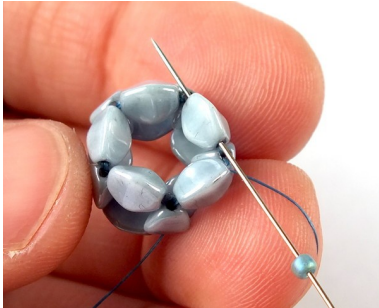


9) Pull snug. This is how the base of our beaded bead looks like.



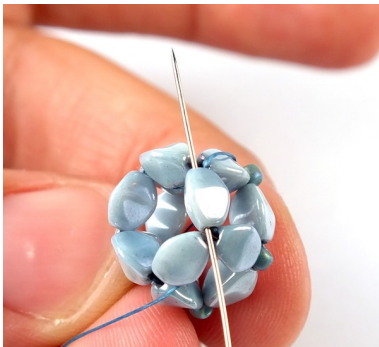
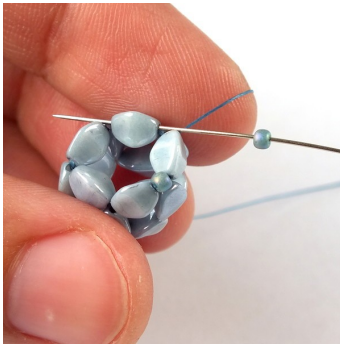


10) Pass through the nearest pinch bead.



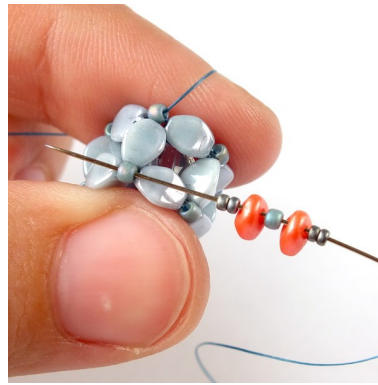
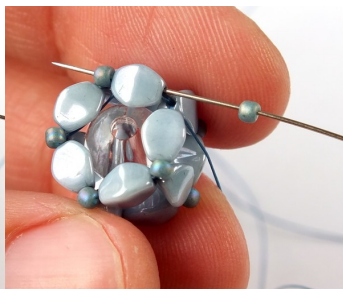
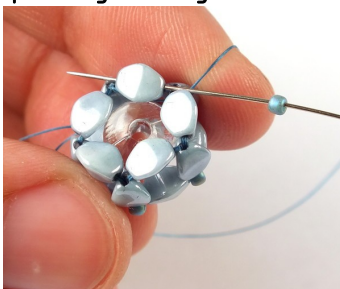
11) Add one 11/0 and pass through the next pinch bead in the row.

12) Repeat step 11, until you reach the end of the row.

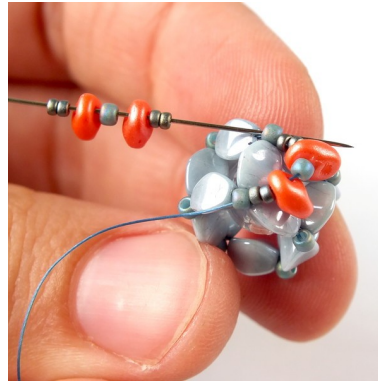


13) Weave through beads to get to the other side of the bead.

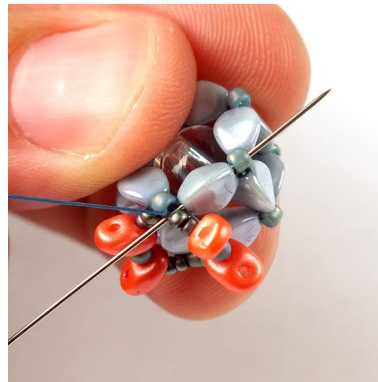
14) Put the core bead inside and then repeat steps 11, until you reach the end of the row. At the end of the row make the step-up by passing through the first 11/0 from this row.



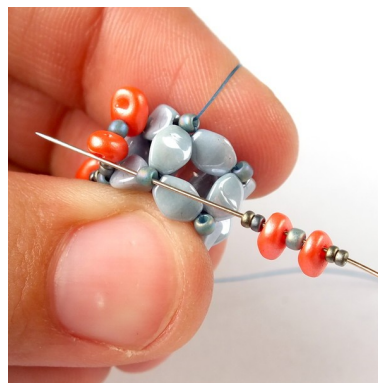
15) Add two 15/0s, one Superduo, one 11/0, one Superduo and two 15/0s. Pass back through the corresponding 11/0 on the other side of the bead.



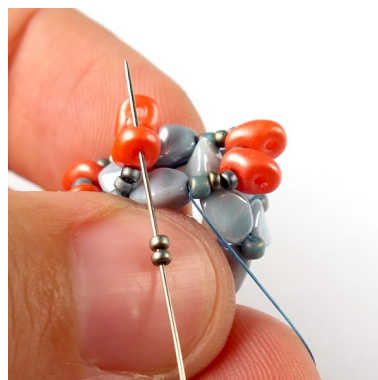
16) Add two 15/0s, one Superduo, one 11/0, one Superduo and two 15/0s. Pass through the same 11/0 you started from in the previous step ...



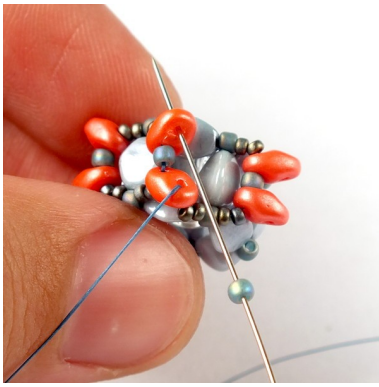
17) ... and then pass through the next pinch bead and through the next 11/0 in the row.



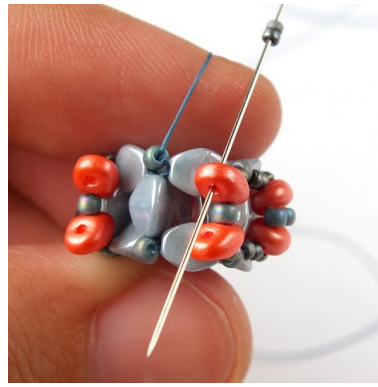
18) Add another "loop" of beads - two 15/0s, one Superduo, one 11/0, one Superduo and two 15/0s - and pass back through the corresponding 11/0 on the other side of the bead.



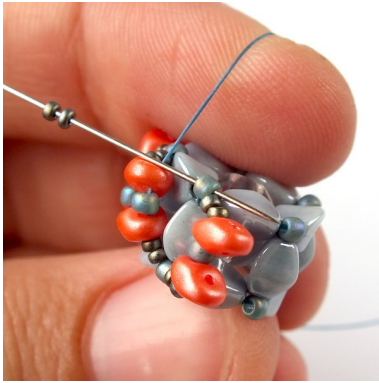
19) Add two 15/0s and go up through the "unused" hole of the nearest Superduo (as shown in the photo).



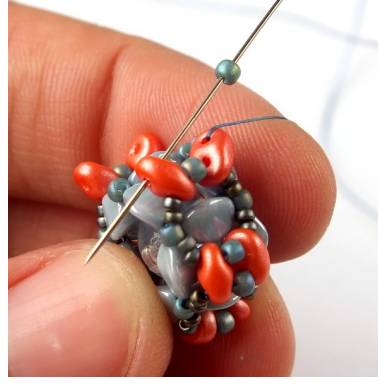
20) Add one 11/0 and go up through the "unused" hole of the next Superduo.



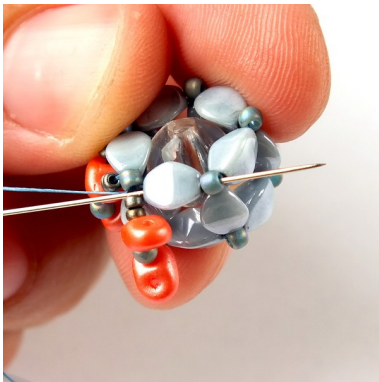
24) When you reach the end of the row, add two 15/0s and pass through the "unused" hole of the nearest Superduo (it is the one we added in step 16).



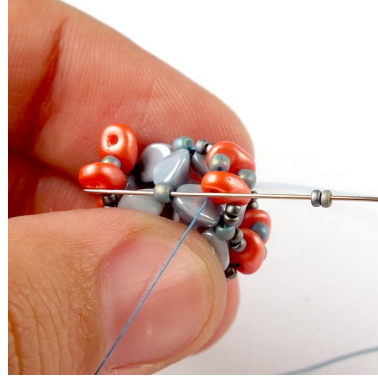
21) Add two 15/0s and pass through the next 11/0 between the pinch beads.



25) Add one 11/0 and go down through the "unused" hole of the next Superduo.

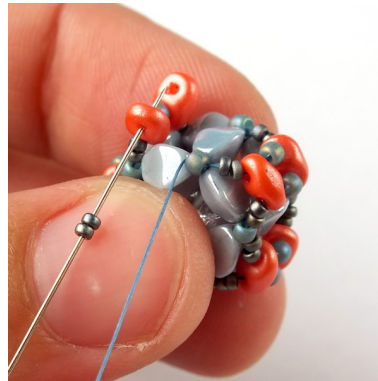
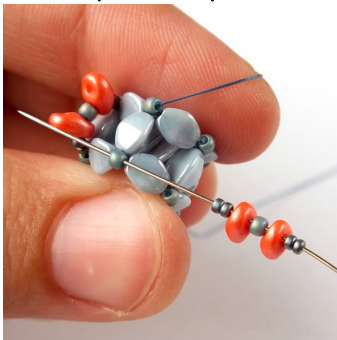


22) And then pass through one pinch bead and one 11/0.

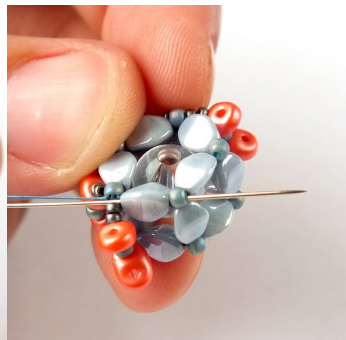
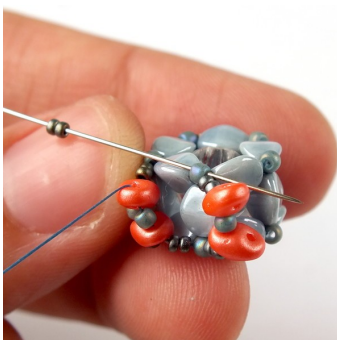


26) Add two 15/0s and pass through the nearest 11/0 between the pinch beads (like shown in the picture).

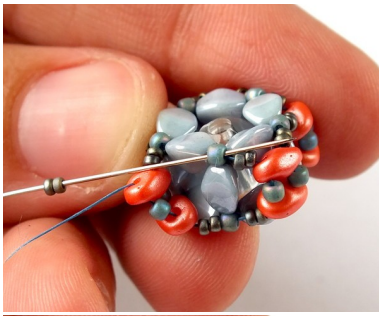
23) Repeat steps 18 - 22 two more times.



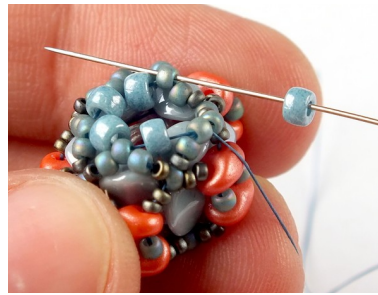
27) Add two 15/0s and go up through the "unused" hole of the nearest Superduo (as shown in the photo).



28) Add one 11/0 and go up through the "unused" hole of the next Superduo.



29) Add two 15/0s and pass through the next 11/0 between the pinch beads.



35) ... until you reach the end of the row.



30) The thread exits from one of the 11/0s. Add one 15/0, three 11/0 and one 15/0 and pass through the next 11/0 in the row.



36) You can weave through the last row few more times.



31) Repeat step 30, until you reach the end of the row.

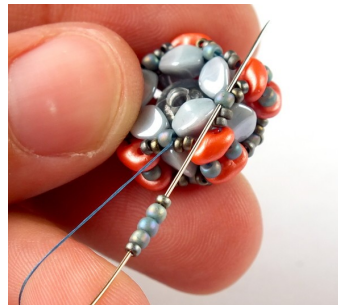


37) Weave through beads to get to the other side of the bead.

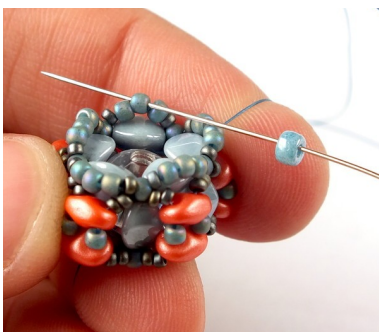
38) Repeat steps 30 - 36 on the other side of the bead.



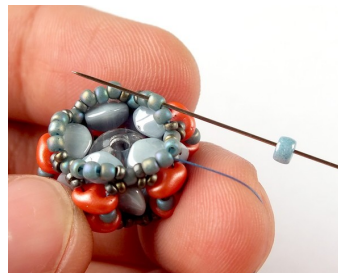
32) At the end of the row make the step-up by passing through the first 15/0 and two 11/0s added in this row.



33) The thread exits from the "middle" 11/0. Add one 8/0 and pass through the "middle" 11/0 from the next loop.



34) Repeat step 33 ...



39) Tie a few half-hitch knots and cut off all the remaining thread. The bead is finished.
