Material: Bracelet 17 cm

- 16 Flat Cabochons 8 mm® par Puca®-Paris
- 15 Faceted Round Beads 3 mm (F3)
- 32 Bicones 3 mm (B3)
- 5 g de Delicas 11/0 (DB11)
- Seed beads 15/0 (SB15) and 11/0 (SB11)
- 1 Clasp of your choice
- Fireline 0.12



1) Pick up 4 SB11

2) Close and reinforce



3) Pick up 1 DB11 between each DB11



4) In each DB11 insert 3 SB11s



5) Here is the result 😊 Exit HERE through the SB11



6) Pick up 1 DB11 through the following three SB11s. All the way around 😊



7) Here is the result Exit HERE through the central SB11



8) Pick up 3 SB11 in each central SB11



9) Here is the result Exit HERE through the central SB11



10) Place the cabochon and insert 3 DB11s between the center SB11s.
Like this all the way around ©



11) Tighten!You will have this.Come to exit through the2nd SB11 HERE



12) Insert 1 F3 in SB11 HERE



13) Make an element and assemble in SB11 HERE (see photo 11)



14) Pass through the F3 then into SB11 HERE



15) Consolidate. Come and stand on the other side HERE (SB11) and place the clasp



16) Insert 1 SB11, the clasp and 1 SB11 (see photo). Reinforce



17) Repeat steps 1 to 11 to make more elements. Then assemble following steps 12 to 15



18) We have 16 elements in all.
Each element measures about 1 cm



19) Place the clasp on the other side .
Come to exit HERE in the SB11 between the DB11



20) Insert 1 SB15, 1 B3, 1 SB15 into SB11.
Exit HERE and repeat this step throughout the round and also on the other side of the bracelet



21) Congratulations!
You have finished your bracelet ©



22) Another idea
Make 5 elements.
Insert a chain and a Stop bead to make a very simple, chic and trendy bracelet

I wish you a happy beading. I offer you this pattern.
